What is a Community League?

Our Community League is a group of people that come together at the neighborhood level, to make their community a better place. We're not-for-profit and led by volunteers that live in the community. We're your neighbors!

Community Leagues are an Edmonton thing! They are similar to community center & neighborhood associations, but over their 100 year history they have developed into their own unique model of local, neighborhood-level governance.

Neighborhoods in Edmonton can form a Community League and will receive some funding from the City to operate. Parkland is set aside for the League, and many Leagues, like ours, build Halls or community center buildings from which to operate neighborhood programs. Although they receive support and work closely with the City of Edmonton, Community Leagues are their own not-for-profits and operate independently. The League Hall and Rink are owned collectively by the members of the League.

If you live in Edmonton, You've probably benefited from your League even if you didn't know it! Have you skated at a local outdoor rink? Registered for community soccer? Participated in a Neighborhood BBQ? You may have enjoyed a local spray park that your League fundraised for or sat on a park bench the League asked the City for.

The amazing thing about Leagues? They are volunteer powered and the volunteers are your neighbors!!

Leagues Are:

- Not for Profits
- Non-partisan, with an inclusive mandate to serve the whole neighborhood
- Funded in part by the City, but their own unique and independent organizations under the Societies Act
- Volunteer run by neighbors who make up the board of directors
- Funded by the City of Edmonton, the Province, and creative fundraising
- Open to anyone who lives in the Neighborhood

Typical League Boards are made up of:

Treasurer, President, Secretary, Social Events Director, Civics Director, Program Director, Sports Directors, Rink Directors, and many more!

If you have ideas for how to make your neighborhood a better place, the League provides a platform to get the word out, fundraise, and mobilize. They have access to funding and a structure of accountability. But! They need volunteers like YOU to make it happen.





What do Leagues do?

Build & maintain local amenities or "community assets"

- Leagues are non-partisan but can bring issues to Council
- Leagues are often consulted about developments in the neighborhood and engage in community consultation

History

The League system was started in 1917 by passionate citizens who wanted their voices heard at City Hall, and have been a part of Edmonton and the City's operations ever since. Edmonton enjoys a tradition of grassroots democracy because the Leagues have grown alongside the City.

In 1917, the Crestwood neighborhood was having trouble getting City Hall to listen to their concerns. The neighborhood was far from downtown, and they were struggling to get basic amenities like sidewalks. The idea of the Community League came from a model in the US called the "City Club" model- a group of men coming together to talk about local issues. Leagues were formed with a similar neighborhood-level focus but were non-partisan and open to anyone that lived within the boundaries of the neighborhood.

What is a Play Street? Play Streets are gatherings that allow neighbours to play together in residential streets closed off to vehicle traffic.

10 Great Reasons to Host a Block Party or Play Street

- 1. Helps us feel safe by knowing who lives around us.
- 2. Promotes interaction between neighbours of all ages.
- 3. Increases a sense of belonging to the community.
- 4. Provides an opportunity to know your neighbours better.
- 5. Encourages neighbours to look after each other & the neighbourhood.
- 6. Connects long-time and new neighbours, and teaches about neighbourhood history.
- 7. Builds stronger communities which have the power to make a difference.
- 8. Animates open spaces for social gatherings and safe, active play.
- 9. Boosts our health when we feel welcomed and included.


Edmonton Neighborhood Watch

Getting to know your neighbours is vital. Not just 2 or 3 people on your street, get to know the majority of the people who live around and near you. You don't need to become best friends but knowing each other by name and feeling comfortable enough to knock on a neighbours door can change your neighbourhood. **Neighbours who know one another look out for one another**.

Hosting a **Block Party** is not only a great way to meet your neighbors, but you will be able to share some information with them that will help create a safer neighbourhood for everyone.

Register for **Walk Your Block**. This program gets residents walking in their own neighbourhood. It is not an organized patrol... it is simply taking a walk where you live. Say hi to neighbours, get to know who and what belongs on your street and be visible. Crime is significantly reduced where community residents are visibly present and are actively involved on their streets and in their neighbourhoods. Crimes don't take place where criminals can be observed. The more you walk, the less likely your neighbourhood will have criminal activity. You are likely already doing most of this program. Now you only have to register (just once) and then log each of your walks (it takes only a minute).

- 1. Walk Walk your dog, take daily walks/runs, even walks to the park with your children.
- 2. Be friendly Take time and greet your neighbors.
- $\mathbf{3}. \mathbf{Be}\xspace$ aware $\mathbf{Be}\xspace$ familiar with the homes & vehicles in your area.
- 4. Report suspicious activities to the police at 780-423-4567. Do NOT confront suspicious individuals.
- 5. Log your walk through the Edmonton Neighborhood Watch website https://enwatch.ca/













La Perle Community Playschool

La Perle Community Playschool is a non-profit, parent-cooperative playschool program that provides a 'learn through play' program for three and four-year-old children; located at Aldergrove Community League Hall, 2nd Floor, in Edmonton, AB Canada.

Parents play a role in the learning. This gives parents a unique opportunity to experience what your child does at playschool!

Philosophy of the Playschool

The activities provided and organized for the children of the Playschool should be creative and stimulating, and should foster an atmosphere of friendship and cooperation. The objectives of the program are:

- Encourage learning through play
- Develop speaking, listening, and learning skills
- Enhance small and large muscle development
- Provide an opportunity for preschoolers to socialize with their peers
- Contribute to the involvement of parents in the education of their children
- Operate as a parent-cooperative playschool

Philosophy of the Teachers

Together, we will enhance the children's understanding of the world around them. We will explore physical, social, and thinking skills through participation and interaction. It is our goal that students have fun and grow through learning at the La Perle Community Playschool.

Our free play centers include a variety of art opportunities, sensory play, dramatic play, open ended toys, math, science, and literacy centers.
