Membership Report 2023/2024

Current memberships sold as of April 12th 2024 is 192 which is 14 more than last year and 25 above the average of the previous 5 years. As our membership period is from September 1st through August 31st there are still a few months left for us to potentially increase this number further for 2024.

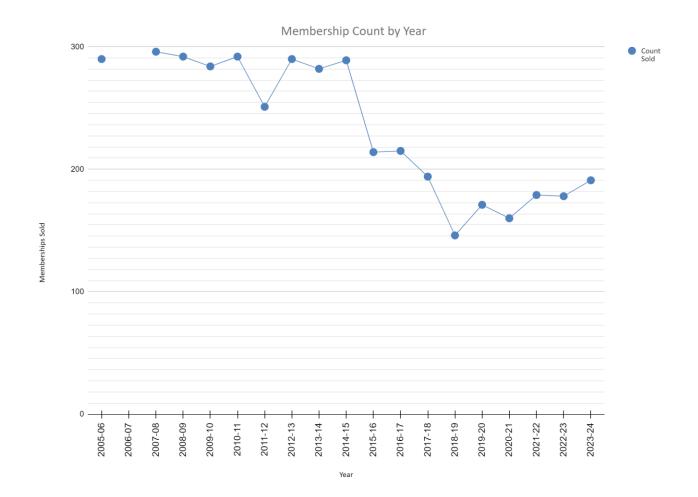
Compared to the totals for last year we are at:

- Family = 149 sold (147 sold in 2022/2023) = 101%
- Single = 6 sold (9 sold in 2022/2023) = 67%
- Senior = 37 sold (22 sold in 2022/2023) = 168%

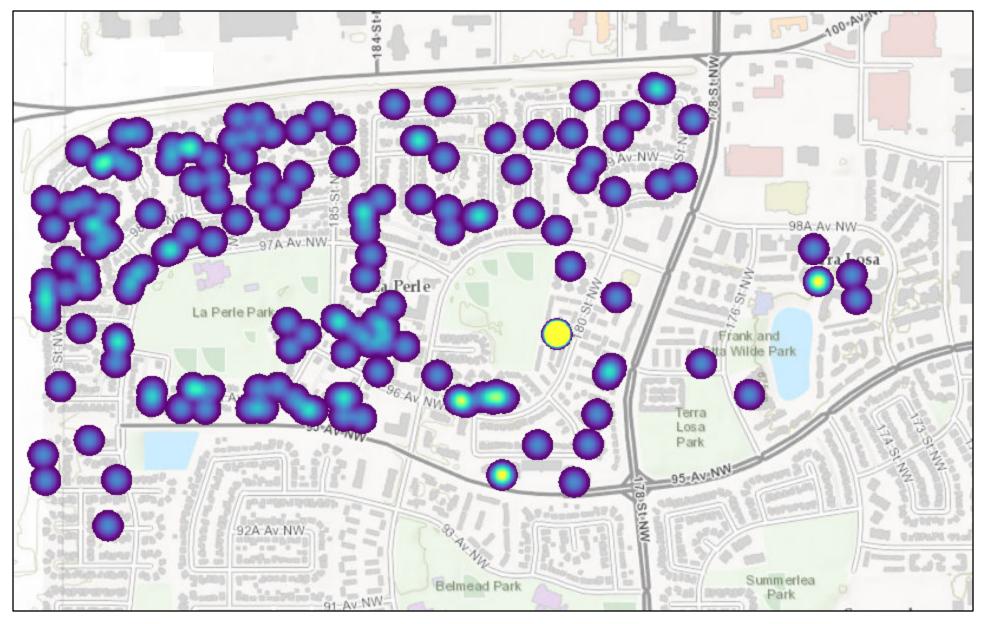
Compared to last year: 192/178 = 108%

Compared to previous 5 years: 192/167 = 115%

We are continuing to see a growth in Family and Senior membership numbers with a drop in Single members, which may indicative of a changing demographics in the neighbourhood. This year we have started a new initiative of complimentary memberships to community residents who attend the AGM. it will be interesting to see how this impacts our membership numbers for next year.



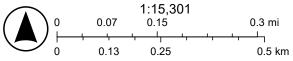
2023 membership

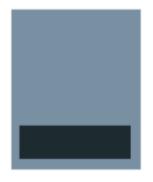

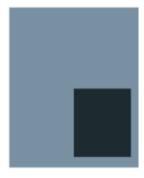

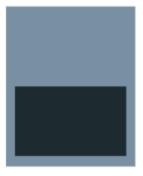
